This year has reminded us just how special home is. Dreams begin at home. Your generosity has allowed us to fulfill the dreams of thousands.



HOUSING PEOPLE

MHP's mission goes beyond building quality affordable housing. Enhancing residents' quality of life also is a central goal, including through innovative projects. One of the innovations MHP is bringing to our acquisitions in the District of Columbia – Worthington Woods and Crescent Park Village – is solar power.

Let the Sunshine In

The solar roof installation project has many benefits, including lowering residents' energy bills and offering potential job opportunities, in addition to the positive environmental impacts.

Worthington Woods

The solar energy installation project launched at Worthington Woods is expected to generate 1.3MW to 1.5MW of electricity, which will be put back into the PEPCO grid. Worthington Woods residents will receive a credit back on their electric bills for the value of the electricity under DC's "Solar for All" program.

The project also will generate 50+ solar installation jobs. Job training and employment in solar energy installation will target to residents of DC's Ward 8,

potentially including residents of Worthington Woods, through WDC Solar, a solar energy installation vendor.

"Our Worthington Woods solar project is one of the larger private solar projects in the District. Residents who qualify will be eligible to receive credits to their electricity bills estimated in the range of \$35 to \$50 per month," says Don Hague, Project Analyst at MHP. "We are also pleased to play a role in furthering DC Mayor Bowser's goal of installing as much solar-generating capacity in the city as possible."



Crescent Park Village

In 2020, MHP also acquired Crescent Park Village (CPV) in Washington, DC. The solar roof installation project at CPV is at a more preliminary stage and is expected to provide the same benefits to residents.

The 110-unit property was built in 1944, and with MHP's modernization efforts, residents will have access to homes with hardwood floors, self-cleaning ovens, dishwashers and more.

CPV is located in an important area. One of the neighborhood's largest historically significant landmarks is Cedar Hill, the home of abolitionist Frederick Douglass. Additionally, CPV is just 2.5 miles from growing commercial developments, National Harbor and the MGM Hotel and Casino.




EMPOWERING FAMILIES

As COVID took hold in Spring 2020, MHP recognized the need to respond quickly to residents' needs. They were facing challenges that included job loss, reduced work hours, health challenges, and food insecurity. We created the COVID Outreach Team to connect one-on-one with MHP residents in need to provide moral support, solve problems, link residents with available services and, as needed, give financial help.

COVID Vaccination Clinics and Emergency Assistance

MHP successfully mobilized and managed COVID testing events for residents of our Wheaton, Great Hope Homes and Dring's Reach communities. In total, more than 1,000 residents were vaccinated in 2020. Much of this work was accomplished in partnership with the African American Health Program and Latino Health Initiative with a focus on providing easier access to vaccinations in communities of color and to address vaccine hesitancy.

Additionally, by the end of 2020, over 60 families had received \$9,000 in grocery store credit cards, and 10 families received weekly fresh produce through a Community Supported Agriculture program. The MHP COVID Outreach Team also connected with more than 400 people to provide guidance in seeking county, state, and federal assistance programs that ultimately offered more relief for residences. Further, the team helped 24 households secure \$22,700 in direct financial assistance from Montgomery County. These families were not eligible for any other type of assistance.



More than 1,000 residents were vaccinated in 2020.

Social and Emotional Education

During the summer of 2020, MHP supported 167 students with the Ready 2 Learn and Play & Learn programs. The students were provided social emotional learning and culturally responsive literacy resources, and received educational toys, ethnic books, and school supplies to aid in their educational experience.



MHP operated the Ready 2 Learn and Play & Learn programs for two hours every weekday. Ready to Learn served 79 kindergarten through 2nd grade students across six sites, and Play & Learn served 88 pre-kindergarten students across five sites. Average monthly attendance was 85%, with a slightly higher attendance rate for Ready to Learn (87%) than for Play & Learn (82%). Approximately 40% of the participants had perfect attendance. By the end of July, all participants who completed Education Galaxy assessments, which are used to prepare for state testing, had increased or maintained their reading level in key areas such as foundations and understanding literary and informational text.

Teacher and Students: Staying Connected

In the midst of the pandemic, MHP students had to adjust to a virtual classroom setting. Although this major adjustment seemed daunting, MHP teachers were determined to stay connected to their students. Knowing that the programs were an important part of students' lives, MHP's Community Life staff worked to continue the level of learning and education students had grown accustomed to.

Jenny Mendez-Guererro, MHP Parent and Child Coordinator, recalls what it was like when the Play & Learn program transitioned to online interaction: "The first session I had was with the pre-school students. To see their faces and seeing how happy they were when saw me and my assistants, it just made my day."

To many of the students, MHP teachers and coordinators play a major part in their lives and offer a positive influence. The Play & Learn Program uses educational activities aligned with Maryland Ready at Five kindergarten readiness standards and allows children to play, explore, and learn letters, words, numbers, and music. Children learn language and math skills, how to identify shapes and colors, and socialization skills.

Our teacher and staff have worked hard throughout the year, ensuring that our students are prepared for kindergarten and beyond. It's working! Approximately 81% of the Play & Learn students passed a kindergarten readiness assessment in 2020. This would not have been possible without our determined staff.













MHP COVID Outreach: Dora's Story

Dora Kellogg moved into affordable housing at MHP's Edinburgh House after her husband's death. She found work at a foundation that focused on providing services for disabled persons in their homes. Dora says she enjoyed her job and often took persons in her care to lunch and dinner, forming a personal bond.



In March 2020, Dora was driving to work and suffered a terrible car accident. "It was a hit and run. People were surprised to see me alive," she recalls. Dora's doctor advised her to discontinue her employment, as her condition made her prone to contracting COVID-19. Soon after resigning her position,

Dora was no longer able to pay her rent. Her property manager contacted MHP staff and shared Dora's need for assistance. MHP's COVID-19 outreach program helped Dora pay for her rent and food.

"There are so many people like me who need help. So, if they can help, let them help. And by their help, we'll be able to survive. We'll be able to have a roof over our heads."

Dora has repeatedly expressed her gratitude to MHP's staff and for the outreach program. "To have somebody when you're in need call you and talk to you, that alone is something. We need people to encourage us."

MHP is grateful for the many donations that made it possible to assist Dora and other MHP residents during such a challenging time.

STRENGTHENING NEIGHBORHOODS

In response to the pandemic, MHP staff began placing well-being calls, checking in on residents and their families. After learning about the hardships many residents were undergoing, MHP formed a COVID outreach team. The team was made up of MHP staff and volunteers dedicated to helping residents face challenges with unemployment, inability to pay rent, and food insecurity. The team was able to connect residents with local, state, and federal resources to help them navigate the challenging months ahead.

COVID Outreach and Response Efforts

The **Resident Emergency Fund** was introduced and supported by the MHP COVID outreach team and funded by voluntary contributions. All donations covered the rent for MHP residents and paid for other necessities such as food and clothing. "The MHP Resident Emergency Fund is supported through donations. It helps residents who lost income or who have reduced income. They receive direct assistance and rental assistance that goes directly toward reducing their balance," explains Martina Tinong, Community Engagement Specialist. Residents that

qualified for assistance from the fund not only received financial support but received the peace of mind knowing that they could stay in their homes. In total, the Resident Emergency Fund donated \$62,885.50 to 116 residents outside of the CSA.

A partnership with CareerCatchers was instituted when MHP became aware of many residents struggling to find employment. This local nonprofit workforce development organization provides personalized career counseling services. A select group of MHP residents engaged with the organization to learn about effective job search techniques, including networking and use of on and offline resources. As a result, residents were

empowered to take the initial steps to find new or better employment.

NeighborWorks VISTA Program, an established MHP partner, was poised to help seek to improve the financial health of small businesses in Long Branch and along Bonifant Street in the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic. Staff was able to grow the social media presence for the Long Branch Business League and the Bonifant Street Business Association, promoting the business districts and engaging potential customers. MHP was also able to secure more than \$400k in relief assistance for small businesses in the Long Branch and Bonifant St. neighborhoods.





MHP Advocacy Efforts for Affordable Housing

MHP joined other affordable housing advocates in successfully pressing the Montgomery County Council to approve a supplemental appropriation to fund the **Affordable Housing Opportunity Fund** to leverage private investment in the preservation and creation of dedicated affordable housing.

MHP President Robert A. Goldman praised Montgomery County's plan to seek additional funding for emergency rental support due to COVID-19. In testimony to the Montgomery County Council, Goldman stated, "We appreciate the County Executive and County Council pursuing every available option to provide rental assistance to residents, and keeping every resident stably housed during this public health crisis." Goldman described many residents' ongoing financial distress, noting, "Despite all of the public and private resources that are available to our residents, many continue to be multiple months behind in their rent and will never be able to pay their back rent if not for outside assistance."

We appreciate the County Executive and County Council pursuing every available option to provide rental assistance to residents, and keeping every resident stably housed during this public health crisis.







A Leader in the Community

When **Evelyn Harrison** learned her Worthington Woods apartment building in Southeast Washington, D.C. was being sold, she knew she needed to act. She learned that under the D.C. Tennant Opportunity to Purchase Act, tenants had the right to organize, allowing them to have a say in the purchaser of the property. Within 60 days, Evelyn and resident volunteers passed out flyers, informed residents by word of mouth, and knocked on doors to acquire the necessary 200 signatures to form the tenants' association.



As the elected president of the association's board. Evelyn learned the process of selecting a developer, and the tenants' association voted and selected MHP as the group to which they would assign their purchase rights. MHP kept the property designated as affordable housing. and the property is now undergoing major renovations and upgrades.

Evelyn has been recognized for her leadership and has been awarded the NeighborWorks America's prestigious 2020 Dorothy Richardson Award for Resident Leadership.
